Ruth Hampton grew up on a farm with her parents, four sisters and four ponies near Whittier, IA as part of Whittier Monthly Meeting. She attended Scattergood Friends School where during the kitchen crews discovered a love of stainless steel and the joy that comes from nourishing large groups of people.

After Scattergood Ruth moved to the Twin Cities for friends, irreverent adventure and school (in that order) and there she explored performance art, was in an all-girl band, and honed her food-skills in restaurants over the years. In the late 1990's she moved to northeast lowa, and in Decorah developed a deli in the local co-op, co-created numerous performance art dinners called Edible Alien Theatre (E.A.T.) and has been running her own catering business Trout River Catering for a couple decades.

Ruth maintains a life-and-recipe blog called AWEsomeCookery.com and has been exploring what it means to 'cook with love' amidst high stress, especially the madness inherent in commercial-scale catering. She is also on the School Committee of Scattergood Friends School, appreciating that teenagers can be great teachers of joy and irreverence.
